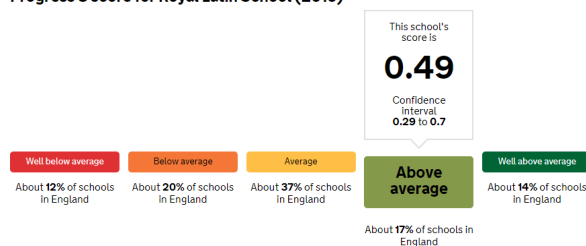

Progress 8 score

This score shows how much progress pupils at this school made between the end of key stage 2 and the end of key stage 4, compared to pupils across England who got similar results at the end of key stage 2. This is based on results in up to 8 qualifications.

Attainment 8 score

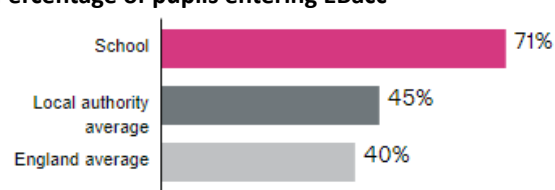
Schools get a score based on how well pupils have performed in up to 8 qualifications.



English Baccalaureate

A pupil is considered to have entered for the English Baccalaureate if they entered for qualifications in English, maths, sciences, a language and either history or geography. The English Baccalaureate (EBacc) is not a test or qualification; it is a measure used to provide information about a particular range of qualifications.

Percentage of pupils staying in education or employment

This shows the percentage of pupils who either stayed in education or went into employment after finishing key stage 4 (after year 11, usually aged 16). This is for pupils who finished year 11 in 2017, which is the most recent data currently available. This figure covers any sustained education or employment destination.

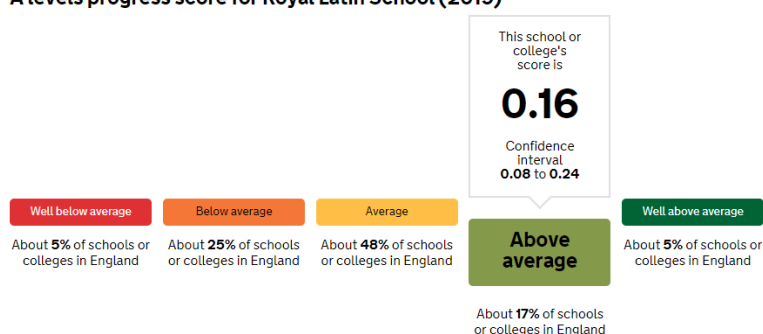

A Level Progress Score, 2019 results:

A levels progress score for Royal Latin School (2019)



Progress scores tell you how much progress students who studied A levels at the Royal Latin School made between the end of key stage 4 and the end of their A level studies, compared to similar students across England.

A score above zero means students made more progress, on average, than students across England who got similar results at the end of key stage 4. A score below zero means students made less progress, on average, than students across England who got similar results at the end of key stage 4.

The majority of schools and colleges have progress scores between -2 and +2.

Academic qualification progress score, 2019 results: +0.15

Academic qualifications include A levels but also other 'level 3' academic qualifications such as International Baccalaureates and Pre-U. These figures are based on students who were entered for at least one academic qualification that takes the same amount of time to study as an AS level or above.

Average result

These figures tell you the average grade and average points that students achieved per A level entry and other 'level 3' academic qualifications. A points value is given to all qualifications so qualifications of a different level, size and grading system can be compared.

NB There were no entries for Applied General qualifications or Tech level qualifications.

Key Stage 4 English and Maths improvement. There were no students entered for any qualifications covered by the measure, for example GCSE re-takes.

Higher education

This information is based on the number of Students finishing 16 to 18 study who entered higher education in 2019 (or deferred entry until 2020) at UK universities, further education colleges and other settings in the United Kingdom.
