What is 'One Medicine'? And how can embracing this concept ensure that humans and animals benefit from equal and sustainable medical progress?

It is time to connect, to bridge the divide between human and animal medicine, driving collaboration and the sharing of knowledge for the benefit of all. After spending 25 years working in animal welfare she started looking at the correlation between animal welfare and human wellbeing and how the two are intrinsically linked.
